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Thorsten Botz-Bornstein was born in Germany, studied philosophy in Paris, and received his Ph.D. from Oxford University. As a postdoctoral researcher based in Finland he undertook extensive research on Russian formalism and semiotics in Russia and the Baltic countries. Since 1999, he is an Associate Researcher at the EHESS of Paris from which he received his 'habilitation.'
